



CHECKLIST

Ensuring compliance for healthcare providers under the 21ST Century Cures Act requires the entire organization to embrace a culture of collaboration. The following checklist is an overarching guide to make a good faith effort towards interoperability and prevent information blocking. As with all regulations, please work with your compliance and legal departments for specific details relevant to your organization.
